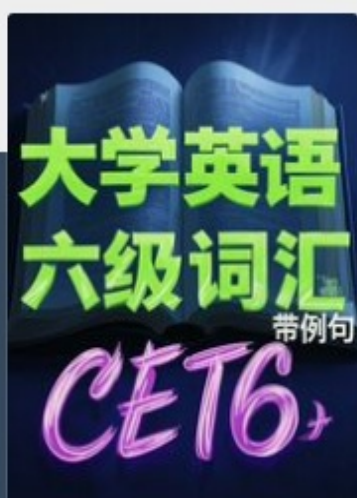

abandon [ə'bændən]

动词[v.]: 1, 抛弃, 放弃; 2, 离弃(家园、船只、飞机等); 3, 遗弃(妻、子女等)

例句1, He decided to abandon his dream of becoming a musician and pursue a more stable career.

他决定放弃成为音乐家的梦想, 转而追求一份更稳定的职业。

例句2, The captain ordered the crew to abandon the ship as it was sinking rapidly.

船长命令船员们弃船, 因为船正在迅速下沉。

例句3, She felt abandoned when her husband left her and their children without any explanation.

当她的丈夫毫无解释地离开她和孩子们时, 她感到被遗弃了。

abnormal [æb'nɔ:məl]

例句1, The doctor noticed some abnormal results in the patient's blood test.

abolish [ə'boʊlɪʃ]

例句2, The abolition of slavery was a significant milestone in human history.

abortion [ə'bo:ʃən]
